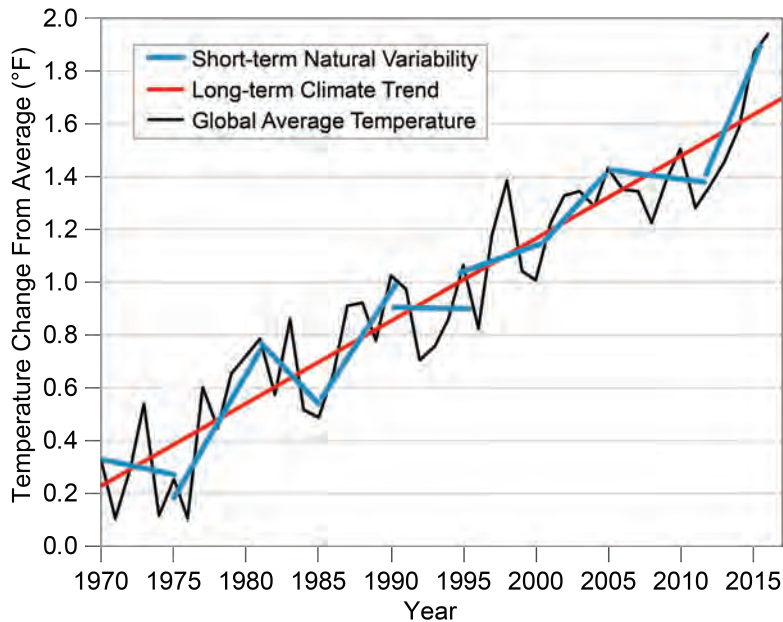


It's Happening. It's Now: The Climate Reports of 2018

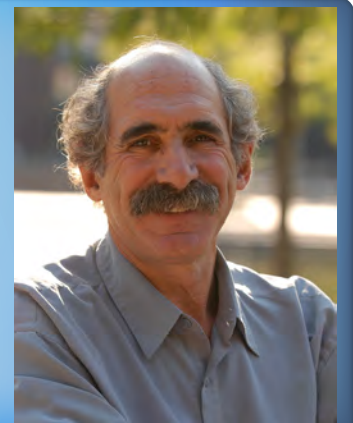
The October special report from the UN International Panel on Climate Change and the November release of the Fourth National Climate Assessment by the U.S. government both warn in stark language that the impact of climate change is upon us, that it affects us no matter where we live, and that time to avoid severe consequences is running out.

Milbank professor of geosciences and international affairs at Princeton University and the director of the Center for Policy Research on Energy and the Environment at Princeton's Woodrow Wilson School.
