

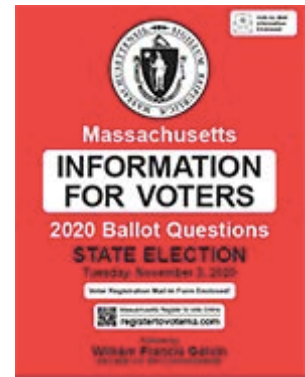
# Voting in the November 3 General Election

## What will Needham voters be voting on?

County, state, and district offices; US House & Senate, US President; 2 statewide ballot questions.

The Secretary of the Commonwealth has distributed to the homes of registered voters the "Information for Voters" red booklet. In addition to the information on the two 2020 ballot questions, there is full information on voting options for the 2020 Election.

## Voter Registration

The deadline to register to vote in the November 3 Election is **Saturday, October 24**. You can check your voter status and/or register to vote at [www.RegisterToVoteMA.com](http://www.RegisterToVoteMA.com). On October 24, Needham residents can register to vote in person by visiting Needham Town Hall during the special voter registration hours of 2-4 pm or 7-8 pm.

## Early Voting by Mail

Voting by mail is available to all voters for the November 3 Election. You must apply to receive a ballot. Many of you likely already applied for a ballot in September at the same time as the primary ballot.

If you are not sure whether you applied for a ballot, visit [www.TrackMyBallotMA.com](http://www.TrackMyBallotMA.com). If you see "Pending" in the Status column for the 11/3/2020 State Election, then you have applied and should receive a ballot from the Needham Town Clerk in October.

You can also use this to see when your ballot was mailed to you and received.

## Steps to Voting by Mail

1. Complete a Vote by Mail application, either by using the paper form or the new Mail-in Ballot Application System ([www.MailMyBallotMA.com](http://www.MailMyBallotMA.com)).
2. Deliver your application to the Needham Town Clerk by mail, Town Hall Drop Box, email ([Votingapplications@needhamma.gov](mailto:Votingapplications@needhamma.gov)), or fax (781-449-1246), or submit your application through the Mail-in Ballot Application System.
3. Vote after your ballot arrives.
4. Return your ballot to Needham Town Clerk by mail or Big Red drop box in front of Town Hall.

To ensure timely delivery of your ballot, it is recommended that you submit your application for a November ballot no later than October 20. Applications received after October 28 cannot be accepted. State Election ballots need to be postmarked no later than November 3 and must be back at your local election office no later than November 6.



## Early Voting In Person

Early Voting in Person will be held at Needham Town Hall at these times:

Sat, Oct 17 & Sun, Oct 18; Sat, Oct 24 & Sun, Oct 25: Noon – 5:00 pm  
Mon, Oct 19 – Fri, Oct 23; Mon, Oct 26 – Fri, Oct 30: 9:00 am – 5:00 pm

Masks and social distancing will be required when entering Town Hall or any polling location.

Election Day: Tuesday, November 3, 2020, 7 am to 8 pm. Precinct polls

A & B: Center at the Heights, 300 Hillside Avenue  
C & D: Newman Elementary School, 1155 Central Avenue  
E & H: Needham Golf Club, 49 Green Street  
F & G: Rosemary Complex, 178 Rosemary Street  
I & J: Town Hall, 1471 Highland Avenue
